## I know all about you

Sometimes it can feel like you're just no good at all, can't it? In a time when unemployment is at near record levels, especially, it can seem that way. When you're not actively engaged in "doing what you do", you can begin to feel like you can't do anything.

Obviously, you're not as smart as you thought you were, or you'd still be working.

Obviously, you're not as talented as you thought you were, or you'd be further ahead.

Wait, here's a real ugly one... Obviously, you're out of God's will or else you'd be in a better place.

Or perhaps the worst one... Obviously, there is no God.

It is at those times when we get to feeling this way, that we have to remember that our enemies - the ones who tell us such lies - are not flesh and blood; but are spiritual. In the same way, when we're in the midst of the battle for our minds and our souls, we must remember that our weapons are also spiritual... and they are mighty, even to the pulling down of strongholds! Look at this beautiful scripture...

For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty by God to the pulling down of strongholds, casting down imaginations and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ (2Cor 10:4,5)

(Rev 12:9,10)

He tells us we're not good enough, not smart enough, not worth anything; or worse yet, not loved by God; or even worse yet, he tells us that there is no God. He tells us that if there was a God, we'd have no problems. But God has not promised that we would have a life with no problems. (2Tim 1:7)
